HERITAGE

WELFARE

Welfare refers to a range of government programs that provide financial or other aid to individuals or groups who cannot support themselves.

Welfare programs are typically funded by taxpayers and allow people to cope with financial stress during rough periods of their lives, guaranteeing basic human needs as food and shelter.

COHOUSING

Cohousing is a cooperative living arrangement in which people build a cluster of single family houses around a common building for shared meals, child care, guest rooms, laundry. Households have independent incomes and private lives, but neighbors collaboratively plan and manage community activities and shared spaces.

LANDSCAPE

Landscape is the visible feature of an area of land, its landforms, and how they integrate with natural or man-made features. Landscapes contribute to our well-being and quality of life, providing the broader context within which we live our lives. Living within aesthetically pleasing landscapes enhance our sense of wellbeing.

UNIONS

Labor unions or trade unions are organizations formed by workers from related fields that work for the common interest of its members. They help workers in issues like fairness of pay, good working environment, hours of work and benefits. They often bargain for better salaries, pensions, holidays, health insurance, sick pay.

GPS

A Global Positioning System is a network of satellites and receiving devices used to determine the location of something on Earth. Some GPS receivers are so accurate they can establish their location within one centimeter. GPS has been developed to allow accurate determination of geographical locations by military and civil users

TRIAL

The trial is the principal method for resolving legal disputes that parties cannot settle by themselves or through less formal methods. The chief purpose of a trial is to secure fair and impartial administration of justice between the parties to the action. Commonly, the word refers to a trail in a courtroom before a judge and jury.

PHISHING

You have to stay on alert while using internet, communicating by email or by short message system. Phishing is a type of social engineering attack often used to steal user data, including login credentials and credit card numbers. It occurs when an attacker, masquerading as a trusted entity, invite a victim into opening an email.

CHILDHOOD

Early years of childhood form the basis of intelligence, personality, social behavior and capacity to learn and grow oneself as an adult. There is a significant evidence that links the circumstances of adversity and habits formed in early years of life to the uncommunicable discomforts of adulthood. Childhood needs social protection.

POPULATION

In industrialized countries, life expectancy and, consequently, the old age population have increased consistently over the last decades. The number of old people is growing around the world chiefly because of the past baby boom which took place after Second World War, and increases in the prevision and standards of healthcare.

DEMOGRAPHY

Demography is the statistic study of populations. Analysis can cover whole societies or groups defined by criteria such as education, nationality, religion and ethnicity. Educational institutions usually treat demography as a field of sociology, studying relationships between economic, social, cultural processes influencing population.

NEWSPAPER

BRAND

RECEIPT

A receipt is a document that represents proof of a financial transaction. It is necessary for tax purposes as proof of certain expenses. It is a document confirming that a customer received the goods or services they paid for or that the business was appropriately compensated for the goods or services they sold to a customer.

INVOICE

An invoice is a time stamped commercial document that describes and records a transaction between a buyer and a seller.
