

1 - NOISE POLLUTION

It is defined as regular exposure to elevated sound levels that may lead to adverse effects in humans or living organisms. According to the World Health Organization, sound levels less than 70 db are not damaging, regardless of how long the exposure is. Exposure for more than 8 hours to constant noise beyond 85 db may be hazardous.

2 – WASTE DISPOSAL

Improper waste disposal is the disposal of waste in a way that has dangerous or negative consequences for the environment. Examples include littering, hazardous waste that is dumped into the ground and not recycling items that should be recycled. Waste contaminates the environment and causes harmful effects on living organisms.
