

1) Good morning, how can I help you? I would like to know where I can park in the area. I am a tourist and I would like to stop for a few hours to visit the city and its famous monuments. I don't know the area and I would be grateful if you could help me and also suggest where I can find the tourist information office.

2) Good morning, how can I reach Piazza dei Miracoli? Good morning, proceed straight for about 200 meters then take the first right until the roundabout. Continue straight until the traffic lights and then turn left. After 200 meters you arrive in Piazza dei Miracoli. I remind you that it is in a pedestrian area. Therefore reachable only on foot.

3) Pisa is a provincial capital city located in Tuscany with around 90,000 inhabitants. Known above all for the famous leaning tower completed in 1372 and located in Piazza dei Miracoli where it stands alongside the monumental cemetery and the baptistery. There is also a prestigious university located there.

4) Palazzo Gambacorti is a historic building in Pisa, site of the municipal administration and the most famous buildings on the Arno riversides of Pisa. It is located on Lungarno Gambacorti, between Via Toselli and Via Degli Uffizi. The meetings of the city council and the council take place there.

5) The favorite destination for the inhabitants of Pisa during the hot summer weekends is certainly Marina di Pisa, only 10 kilometers from the city centre. It is located at the so-called Bocca d'Arno, the point where the river flows into the Tyrrhenian Sea.

6) The shore of the beaches of Marina di Pisa is narrow and long and composed of small and medium-sized white gravel and pebbles. To the north of the beach of Marina di Pisa is "Bocca d'Arno", the mouth of the Arno River; here it is possible to moor and rent small boats.

7) The Gioco del Ponte is a historic event that takes place every year on the last Saturday of June on the Ponte di Mezzo in Pisa. It is part of the numerous historical events included in the Pisan June and involves twelve teams.

8) Every last Saturday in June twelve teams of twenty players each face each other, pushing forcefully and using their legs and neck, but not their arms, a very heavy trolley that runs on rails, positioned in the center of the Ponte di Mezzo sul Lungarni.

9) Pisan June is a set of events whose most important event is the celebrations for the patron saint San Ranieri, on June 17th. On this occasion the riversides are lit up with lights and the event ends with a fireworks display.

10) The Regatta of the Ancient Maritime Republics is a sporting event of historical re-enactment, with the aim of recalling the exploits and rivalry of the four most famous Italian maritime republics: Amalfi, Pisa, Genoa and Venice.

11) According to tradition, in Pisa on March 25th the traditional New Year in Pisan style occurs, which marks the arrival of the new year on the occasion of the Annunciation to the Virgin Mary of the incarnation of Jesus. It is celebrated with processions in typical costumes of the period along the main streets of the city.

12) Tuscany is a region in central Italy. Its capital, Florence, is home to some of the most famous works of Renaissance art and architecture in the world, such as Michelangelo's David, Botticelli's works in the Uffizi Gallery and the Duomo.

13) The symbol of the Tuscany Region is the winged horse Pegasus, silver in colour, inserted into a shield with a red field and accompanied by the writing Regione Toscana. The same is also found on the uniforms of the Municipal Police.

14) The Pisan coast extends from Marina di Vecchiano, near the mouth of the Serchio river, to Livorno. The Pisan coast is famous for its crowded beaches of Tirrenia and Marina di Pisa, as well as the quieter beaches of Marina di Vecchiano and Calambrone

15) Chianti is the hilly area between Florence and Siena, between Arezzo and the Pisan Hills, which has always been considered the 'heart of Tuscany'; it is a succession of splendid landscapes marked by dense vineyards, chestnut, oak and holm oak woods, evocative medieval villages, romantic castles and fascinating farmhouses.

16) Good morning, can you tell me where I can find the Lost Property Office? Good morning, continue straight along Corso Italia. Once you arrive on Piazza Vittorio Emanuele, cross it and take the first right. Continue until the traffic lights and turn left. After 20 meters the Office is on your left.

17) Good morning, I would like to know what to do. I lost my documents. Good morning, in case of loss of some documents, a report is required at the police offices in order to obtain the issue of a new document or a duplicate.

18) If a citizen loses their documents, the first thing to do is to file a report, within 48 hours, with the police and then request the various duplicates from the competent offices.

19) The territory of the Tuscany region is varied, and includes the rugged Apennines, the beaches of the island of Elba in the Tyrrhenian Sea, the olive groves and vineyards of Chianti located in the famous rolling hills. Tuscany can be defined as the cradle of the Italian language.

20) A cycle path is a protected route or in any case reserved for bicycles, where motorized traffic is generally excluded. The purpose of these routes is to separate cycle traffic from motorized traffic and pedestrian traffic, to improve road safety and facilitate the movement of vehicles.

21) Good morning, where can I rent electric bicycles? Good morning you can go to the square in front of the Municipality where you will find some available. Proceed straight and turn right at the first intersection. Bicycles are just around the corner.

22) The siren is a device that generates intense and continuous acoustic signals, used by industrial plants, by vehicles for emergency use (by the police, fire brigade and first aid) and also for aerial warnings during the war.

23) A public competition is nothing more than a selection carried out between several people who "compete" for a certain number of jobs made available by a public administration from which a ranking is generated.
